Helping Make State and Municipal Governments More Efficient and Effective

Assists policymakers in developing sustainable spending practices and revenue policies, partially through . . .

- Serving on and supporting committees to recommend state spending of \$1.1 billion in [federal rescue funds](#) and address [Providence's financial challenges](#).
- Developing an interactive [financial data dashboard](#) to assist municipal leaders in decision making.

Protecting Taxpayers

Advocates for preserving and improving Rhode Island's tax climate, in part by . . .

- Collaborating with the business community to effectively oppose [economically harmful tax proposals](#), including an income tax hike for high earners.
- [Analyzing](#) Rhode Island's business tax climate ranking and making [recommendations](#) for policymakers, such as exploring changes to the state corporate income tax.

Improving K-12 Education

Supports and advances K-12 education reform through work like . . .

- An [Analysis of Charter Public Schools](#) in Rhode Island, a report [reframing](#) the debate around the proposed charter school moratorium.
- A school reopening and distance learning [report](#) that found [increased inequity](#) between low-income students and their peers during the pandemic.
